Dear Resident

You have **THREE** votes in the Hangleton & Knoll ward at the City Council elections on Thursday 4th May and these will be crucial in deciding the future of Hangleton & Knoll.

Benfield Valley is under threat, after Labour and Green Councillors voted six times to build on it as part of their joint development plan. This must be stopped - and only Conservative Councillors will save Benfield.

Congestion on the Old Shoreham Road reached peak levels after Labour Councillors installed temporary cycles lanes blocking two lanes of traffic - against residents' wishes. Now the Greens and Labour have voted to bring them back in the future as part of their local transport plan. Only the Conservatives will stop the cycle lanes returning.

Hangleton Parks are at risk after Labour and Green Councillors voted for a City Budget which includes introducing charging for parking at suburban parks.

Only Conservative Councillors will save Benfield Valley; stop paid parking being introduced at Hangleton parks; and prevent the return of the Old Shoreham Road temporary cycle lanes.

As your local Conservative Councillor team we have stood up for residents of Hangleton & Knoll at the City Council.

We have fought many campaigns to save Benfield Valley from development going back to 2006 and will never stop fighting to protect this green space. We have worked with the Benfield Valley Project and Sussex Wildlife Trust and presented a

petition signed by 2,643 residents. The future of Benfield is on the line after Labour & Green Councillors voted 6 times to build houses on it at the City Council during the past four years.

Working with residents, we have led successful campaigns to Stop the Council closing Stapley Rd and to remove the Temporary Cycle Lanes at Old Shoreham Rd, which caused enormous

congestion and pollution after they were installed by Labour without consultation. Now Labour & Green Councillors have voted to bring these back in the future. Only the Conservatives will stop them returning.

Working with local schools, teachers, parents and traffic officers, we have progressed plans for improvements in the Hangleton Way schools zone including a

proper pedestrian crossing.

With the support of the community, we arranged events to bring the elderly together; helped Churchill House residents install water butts for their allotments; and secured funding for new bins at Knoll Park.

We are always on call and working for residents in Hangleton & Knoll.
