INCREASING TREE-PLANTING AND FIGHTING FLOODING

In 2019, Conservative councillors put forward a plan for a new 8,000-tree wood and meadow in Carden Hill. We regularly join volunteers in planting trees and weeding to ensure this new wood and meadow is a success. We also work with residents to reduce the impact of flooding, and lobbu the council for better flood defences.



PROTECTING OUR URBAN FRINGE

Greens and Labour voted for 16 urban fringe sites across Brighton & Hove to be developed for housing. With the support of residents we launched a petition against the plans - which attracted 1,604 signatures - and successfully campaigned to stop the development of land next to Horsdean Recreation Ground: the only site in Brighton and Hove saved. We have also supported our allotments by providing funds to help allotment holders to remove rubbish and improve securitu.



LISTENING TO PARENTS AND TEACHERS

We supported parents and teachers in their successful campaign to stop Carden Primary's entry places from being reduced from 60 pupils a year to 30; helping protect its budget, staffing levels and keeping the school serving pupils in our close-knit community. We have also worked with parents to ensure our plauarounds are improved and will continue to work to ensure these facilities are at the standard expected by the parents.



GOOD REASONS TO VOTE CONSERVATIVE IN PATCHAM & HOLLINGBURY

LOOKING AFTER OUR HERITAGE

Patcham & Hollingbury is lucky to have some important heritage sites. We work hard to ensure these sites such as our ancient dovecote and the Peace Gardens are looked after. We contact the council for repairs as soon as we notice damage, including to keep the Patcham Clock on time!



REDUCING LITTER AND CLEANING GRAFFITI

The council does not organise enough litter clearances along the A27. We collect litter personally and have also lobbied the council to ensure litter on this major road is collected more frequently. We work to report graffiti and keep public amenities clean. We also litter-pick in our parks to help ensure they stay free of rubbish.



We work hard to reduce flytipping and have successfully lobbied for CCTV, for example in Birch Grove Crescent. We have campaigned for safer streets and successfully had lights and signs installed in Winfield Avenue. We have also campaigned for more resurfacing of roads - for example Vale Avenue - and prompt pothole-repairs. We also lobby for streetlights and signs to be fixed.
